You will learn how to read evidence left behind by wildlife in the form of tracks and sign; scrapes, wallows, and marks on trees. Winter is a wonderful time to learn more about the animals that inhabit Stowe's woods. We will visit a variety of habitats and learn from Susan why certain types of habitats are so worthy of conservation. During the field outings we will move through the woods at a leisurely pace. Please dress warmly and bring a backpack to carry a hot beverage, snacks and extra layers of clothing. Depending on the weather, be sure to bring snowshoes or "creepers" for your boots, which have spikes to help with traction on icy surfaces.
